### **EVANGELISM**


- How and why do we bring people into the church?

### **EXERCISE**

- > Share the Gospel with someone here (if there is time).
  - Remember that it happens organically.
  - If you try to force a method, it will most likely be awkward.
  - The more deeply you know God, the more naturally it comes to talk about Him with others.
- Remember, the most important thing we can do is know God more.
  - Be committed to a local church body where God's word is correctly taught.
  - Den your Bible, read it, and ask the difficult questions.



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- "If everyone is trying to lead, there is no one to be leading. But if everyone is trying to serve, no one gets left out."
- How do we prepare for each sermon or lesson?
  - Begin with personal growth, not the growth of others
  - Prayerfully select content
  - Study the whole topic or book
  - Study each passage or sub-topic again

- How do we study the Bible?
  - What are the dangers with topical preaching or teaching?
  - Always begin with the text.
    - Read it.
    - Learn the terminology.
    - What theological truths are explicitly stated in the text?

- Is there anything that is unclear, vague, or ambiguous in the text?
  - Is the doctrine explained more clearly in another passage?
- Write or type these truths in your own words.
- Plan your application beforehand.
- Properly use commentaries, study Bible notes, and other secondary sources.
  - The Bible is our primary, and only necessary, source.

- The moment of truth.
  - Have you ever had an embarrassing teaching moment?
  - How can we avoid distractions?

  - ▶ God's word is too important to present flippantly.
- Answering questions without chasing rabbits.
- The importance of answering questions.
  - We are talking to people, not at them.
- It's about the content, not the teacher.
